F. BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES/UNFINISHED BUSINESS

F.1 Covid-19 Property Tax financing program

The CAO spoke about the Property Tax Financing Program with the recent change of the Premier and the appointment of the new cabinet the CAO has not reached out to the Province to see if the financing program would be offered to Municipalities this year however there is likely nothing prohibiting the Town of Digby offering the program again. Mayor Cleveland provided an overview To the new Council members of the program that was offered last year. When the Town launched this Program in the fall of 2020 we only had one commercial property take advantage of the program and once the Province announced a rebate to tourist accommodation owner that tax bill was paid in full as it was a requirement in order to qualify for the Provincial rebate. The new Minister of Municipal Affairs will be coming to meet with the Council at some point if anyone has questions prepare them before his arrival. .

G. REPORTS

G.1 Chief Administrative Officer Report

The CAO spoke about the Covid-19 popup testing site here in Digby and his assistance along with the REMO coordinator in finding a suitable location in a limited amount of time. The CAO also spoke about the Intermunicipal agreement between the Town and Municipality that has been in place since 2009 for the formation of a Regional Emergency Management Organization. The position is currently an employee of the Municipality of Digby the agreement for the cost of the operations is 60% from the Municipality of Digby and 40% from the Town of Digby. The salary allocation for that position is \$5,000 the district pays \$3,000 and \$2,000 for the Town. The Municipality has done a review of the breakdown on the current salary. The review concluded That the allocation of \$5,000 does not properly reflect the duties and time for REMO duties and that the proper allocation should be \$10,000 with the Municipality of Digby paying \$6,000 and the Town of Digby paying \$4,000 this allocation does not result in a pay increase for the REMO Coordinator. The CAO believes that this salary for the REMO Coordinator's position represents very good value for both the town and the District. The tax overpayment for John MacAlpine has been signed by John and released. The Covid-19 gathering limits and physical distancing limits in the Health Protection Act Order have changed over time and continue to do so. The current hosting limit is 50 per cent of a venue's capacity to a maximum of 100 indoors this includes meetings of council and other committees. The Racquette pond park sign has been worked on by EyeCandy Signs a draft was distributed to the Council for review. The wording on the draft to indicate the longest serving Mayor we may not want to have that working on there. The family was ok not having that on there. The plan for the park will be to have interpretive panels installed there and that will likely be the place to have signage on the former mayor and the history The CAO reached out to our MLA Gordon Wilson and he is waiting to see what the spring sitting will entail. Then he can ask that this be put on a private members legislative agenda.

G.2 Digby Area Recreation Commission

G.3 Committee of the Whole

And whereas the feasibility study will not require a financial contribution from the Town of Digby but would require municipal staff time and access to available utility and planning data.

Therefore be it resolved that the Council of the Town of Digby support WestFor Management Inc.'s application to the Nova Scotia Forestry Innovation Transition Fund for funding of a feasibility study of a district heating system development for the Town of Digby.

And therefore also be it resolved that the Town of Digby through the CAO provide staff time and access to available utility and planning data.

J. NEW BUSINESS

J.1 Decker memorial

Councillor Saulnier asked for some sort of memorial to the young man who recently passed as a result of a house fire perhaps we consider naming a section of the trail "Decker's Way" or something to honor the memory of this young man. The Public Works Department asked if they could use one of the benches along the trail and they would pay for a memorial plaque for a bench. The CAO has been speaking with a gentleman that was interested in doing a sign or something to also honor the memory but that person wanted to remain anonymous but he would likely be willing to work with us on a design and carving for the trail. Councillor Saulnier would like a design that could be used in the future for other memorials.

J.2 Covid-19 spending

The Town of Digby received Covid-19 funding the spending criteria still is totally unclear. One item that we are doing is an electronic upgrade of audio and visual equipment so that we can conduct Business during the Covid-19 pandemic. The CAO inquired to see if Council wanted to upgrade their tablets the current tablets have been used for 5 years and they are small and we can upgrade them under this funding program. The Council would like to have full size rather than small tablets. The CAO will look into the purchase of new Council devices.

J.3 Grants to Organizations

The deadline for applications for the Community Grant Program ended on January 31 all the submissions are now on the Digby Cloud for viewing. The CAO is suggesting that Council review them at the upcoming Committee of the Whole Meeting in March.

J.4 Dogs

Councillor McCormick asked about registration for dogs is this an annual fee. The current fee comes from the Dog By law that we have in place if Council wants to change the fee from yearly to once time only we can look into this but it will involve the development of a new by law. Councillor McCormick also asked about the current dog park is there a plan to expand that dog

park and make it larger the dog park was created from a grant that we received if in the future grant money became available again it can be discussed.


